Tim Winton is one of Australia's foremost authors, with a strong local and international reputation.

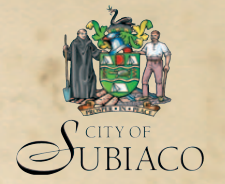
Tim was born in Western Australia,

where he still resides, and is the

author of over twenty books, including novels, short stories, non-fiction and books for children. Tim decided he wanted to be a writer at the age of ten. Today a world-class author, he is a fine example and inspiration for all young writers.

Four times winner of the Miles Franklin Award and twice shortlisted for the Booker Prize, Tim's work continues to be critically admired and loved by Australian and international readers. Many of his best-loved works, including *Cloudstreet*, *The Riders*, *Dirt Music* and *Lockie Leonard*, have been adapted for film, television, radio and stage. Tim has a passion for theatre and debuted as a playwright in 2011.

■ Calling all young writers

The City of Subiaco is proud to coordinate the Tim Winton Award for Young Writers, which this year turns twenty-one.

The award encourages creativity and imagination, and is a great opportunity for you to develop your writing skills. All school students aged between five and eighteen years in Western Australia are encouraged to put pen to paper and be a part of the award.

A special book featuring twenty years of winning entries will be published later this year. Details will be available on the city's website www.subiaco.wa.gov.au in August.

■ Categories

Entries are judged individually in the following categories:

- A Lower primary** – years one and two
- B Middle primary** – years three and four
- C Upper primary** – years five and six
- D Lower secondary** – years seven, eight and nine
- E Upper secondary** – years ten, eleven and twelve

■ Prizes and exhibition

Finalists will be notified by mail in August regarding the presentation ceremony. Awards will be presented at Subiaco Library, and best-placed category finalists who live and study outside the Perth metropolitan area will receive travel and accommodation assistance to attend the presentation ceremony.

The 2013 Tim Winton Award will be presented to the most outstanding entry. Prizes will also be awarded for first, second and third place in each category. Each winner will receive recognition and prizes from the City of Subiaco and the award sponsors.

■ Conditions of entry

- The award is open to all Western Australian school students aged between five and eighteen years.
- Entries must be works of prose of any length up to a maximum of 2000 words.
- Entries must be submitted on standard A4 paper, and may be typed or handwritten.
- Entries must be solely the work of the writer, and only one entry per person will be accepted. No ideas should be copied from television, film or books, nor should the entry be edited by another person.
- Entries must be submitted to Subiaco Library by no later than 5.30pm on Friday 31 May 2013.
- All entries must be accompanied by a completed entry form.
- The judges' decision is final. Due to the high number of entries received, individual feedback cannot be provided.
- Entries are not retained and cannot be returned. The City of Subiaco will accept photocopies of original work.
